Hase-dera is also a place we visited on the school trip.



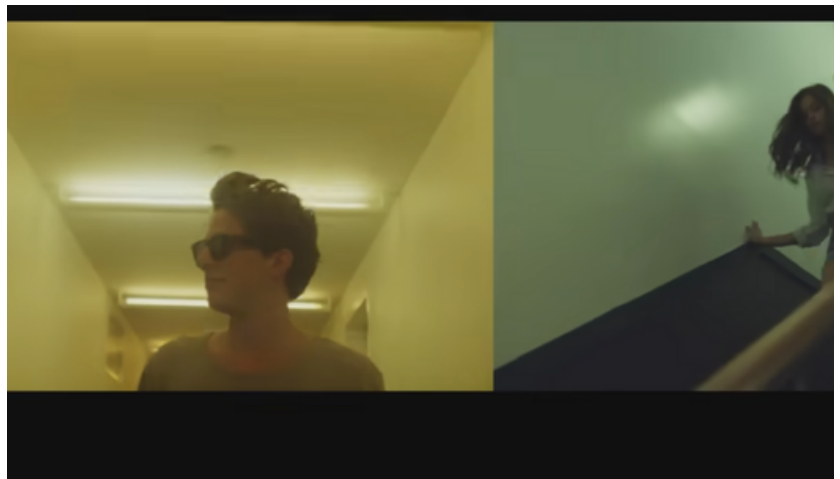
